Wood for donation to airplane crash victims in Parañaque





Plane crash December 10, 2011 in suburban a shanty town Parañaque City, South of Manila, a light plane crashed into a school building near the Philippine Capital after its pilot requested an emergency landing shortly after takeoff, killing over a dozen of people and at least 50 houses were razed, home to an estimated 600 people in Barangay Don Bosco in Parañaque.

Inc. in coordination with the German European School Manila GESM and Philippine Economic Zone Authority PEZA, donated 1 ten wheeler truck load of used wood (wooden pallets and crates) and 20 sets of hammer with 20 kilos of nails to the 42 Families victims of the plane crash incident.
